Jesus is Heir of Everything

Jesus' Authority is Questioned (Mark 11:27-31)

- Then they came again to Jerusalem. And as He was walking in the temple, the chief priests, the scribes, and the elders came to Him. **Mark 11:27 NKJV**
- And they said to Him, "By what authority are You doing these things? And who gave You this authority to do these things?" **Mark 11:28 NKJV**
- But Jesus answered and said to them, "I also will ask you one question; then answer Me, and I will tell you by what authority I do these things: **Mark 11:29 NKJV**
- The baptism of John—was it from heaven or from men? Answer Me." **Mark 11:30 NKJV**
- And they reasoned among themselves, saying, "If we say, 'From heaven,' He will say, 'Why then did you not believe him?' **Mark 11:31 NKJV**
- But if we say, 'From men'"—they feared the people, for all counted John to have been a prophet indeed. **Mark 11:32 NKJV**
- So they answered and said to Jesus, "We do not know." And Jesus answered and said to them, "Neither will I tell you by what authority I do these things." **Mark 11:33 NKJV**

Jesus Responds with a Parable (Mark 12:1-12)

- Then He began to speak to them in parables: "A man planted a vineyard and set a hedge around it, dug a place for the wine vat and built a tower. And he leased it to vinedressers and went into a far country. **Mark 12:1 NKJV**

- Now at vintage-time he sent a servant to the vinedressers, that he might receive some of the fruit of the vineyard from the vinedressers. **Mark 12:2 NKJV**
- And they took him and beat him and sent him away empty-handed. **Mark 12:3 NKJV**
- Again he sent them another servant, and at him they threw stones, wounded him in the head, and sent him away shamefully treated. **Mark 12:4 NKJV**
- And again he sent another, and him they killed; and many others, beating some and killing some. **Mark 12:5 NKJV**
- Therefore still having one son, his beloved, he also sent him to them last, saying, 'They will respect my son.' **Mark 12:6 NKJV**
- But those vinedressers said among themselves, 'This is the heir. Come, let us kill him, and the inheritance will be ours.' **Mark 12:7 NKJV**
- So they took him and killed him and cast him out of the vineyard. **Mark 12:8 NKJV**
- "Therefore what will the owner of the vineyard do? He will come and destroy the vinedressers, and give the vineyard to others. **Mark 12:9 NKJV**
- Have you not even read this Scripture: "The stone which the builders rejected Has become the chief cornerstone. **Mark 12:10 NKJV**
- This was the Lord's doing, And it is marvelous in our eyes'?" **Mark 12:11 NKJV**
- And they sought to lay hands on Him, but feared the multitude, for they knew He had spoken the parable against them. So they left Him and went away. **Mark 12:12 NKJV**

EXPLORING THE JOY OF EASTER

Parent Engagement: Play this game with your whole family or with some friends. Sit in a circle. Roll the stone (a ball) to each other. As each person rolls the stone to someone else, share the Good News by saying, "Jesus is Alive!"

Memory Verse: The disciples were absolutely terrified. "Who is this man?" they asked each other. "Even the wind and waves obey him!" Mark 4:41

Heart of the Lesson: Jesus is Unlike Any Other - How the Disciples Saw Jesus Mark 4:35-41, 6:45-50, 9:2-13

Parent Engagement: Put yourselves in the disciples shoes. What do you think you would have been thinking when Jesus multiplied the bread, raised the dead, ate with sinners, calmed the sea, and spoke against the religious leaders?

The book of Mark describes how a lot of people had different views of who Jesus was. Each week we will discover how Jesus is seen from a new perspective, and see the way they answer the question: Who is this Man? Throughout the next several weeks, we will be challenging the 5th and 6th graders to reflect and discover: Who is Jesus to you? If Jesus really is who He says He is, God in human form, it changes everything.
