(Acts 11:27-30)

Pray God makes up the gap from \$20M to \$21.7M

What are some indicators of low generosity?

- You give very little
- You give expecting things in return
- You give things you don't want
- You give if it doesn't cost you

- When God moves you to give regularly
- out of all your resources (time, talents, treasures)
- to high sacrifice and high faith

For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though He was rich, yet for your sakes He became poor, that you through His poverty might become rich. **2 Corinthians 8:9 NKJV**

...For everyone to whom much is given, from him much will be required... Luke 12:48 NKJV

Now Jesus sat opposite the treasury and saw how the people put money into the treasury. And many *who were* rich put in much. **Mark 12:41 NKJV**

Then one poor widow came and threw in two mites, which make a quadrans. Mark 12:42 NKJV

So He called His disciples to *Himself* and said to them, "Assuredly, I say to you that this poor widow has put in more than all those who have given to the treasury; **Mark 12:43 NKJV**

for they all put in out of their abundance, but she out of her poverty put in all that she had, her whole livelihood." Mark 12:44 NKJV

How did the church of Antioch model high generosity?

Then one of them, named Agabus, stood up and showed by the Spirit that there was going to be a great famine throughout all the world, which also happened in the days of Claudius Caesar. Acts 11:28 NKJV

Then the disciples, each according to his ability, determined to send relief to the brethren dwelling in Judea. Acts 11:29 NKJV

This they also did, and sent it to the elders by the hands of Barnabas and Saul. Acts 11:30 NKJV

And Joses, who was also named Barnabas by the apostles (which is translated Son of Encouragement), a Levite of the country of Cyprus, **Acts 4:36 NKJV**

having land, sold *it*, and brought the money and laid *it* at the apostles' feet. Acts 4:37 NKJV

As they ministered to the Lord and fasted, the Holy Spirit said, "Now separate to Me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them." Acts 13:2 NKJV

Then, having fasted and prayed, and laid hands on them, they sent them away. Acts 13:3 NKJV

Heart of the Lesson: What does the H in Antioch mean? - Acts 11:27-30, Mark 12:41-44

Parent Engagement: Read Mark 12:41-44. Generosity is more about our heart than what we do. Challenge your kids, what is something they can be generous about?

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What are the ANTIOCH values? What do they mean? And why are we learning about them? As we celebrate Grace's 25th anniversary as a whole church, our 5th and 6th graders will have the opportunity to embark on a mystery to discover the ANTIOCH values and how they fit into them. We will be starting our time in Large Group answering clues to discover what the value is for the week. Then, we will go into Small Group discussion to talk about what the value means and how it applies to their lives. We will gather back into Large Group to debrief together.
