- Our kids' lack of interest



Psalm 1:3 NKJV - He shall be like a tree Planted by the rivers of water, That brings forth its fruit in its season, Whose

leaf also shall not wither; And whatever he does shall prosper.

Psalm 1:4 NKJV - The ungodly are not so, But are like the chaff which the wind drives away.
Psalm 1:5 NKJV - Therefore the ungodly shall not stand in the judgment, Nor sinners in the congregation of the righteous.
Psalm 1:6 NKJV - For the LORD knows the way of the righteous, But the way of the ungodly shall perish.

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Parenting with Purpose propels our kids to God's Work (GO)

Parents with Purpose Pray and Worship God

1 Samuel 1:19 NKJV - Then they rose early in the morning and worshiped before the Lord, and returned and came to their house at Ramah. And Elkanah knew Hannah his wife, and the Lord remembered her.

1 Samuel 1:20 NKJV - So it came to pass in the process of time that Hannah conceived and bore a son, and called his name Samuel, saying, "Because I have asked for him from the Lord."

Parents with Purpose prioritize God

1 Samuel 1:21 NKJV - Now the man Elkanah and all his house went up to offer to the Lord the yearly sacrifice and his vow.

1 Samuel 1:22 NKJV - But Hannah did not go up, for she said to her husband, "Not until the child is weaned; then I will take him, that he may appear before the Lord and remain there forever."

1 Samuel 1:23 NKJV - And Elkanah her husband said to her, "Do what seems best to you; wait until you have weaned him. Only let the Lord establish His word." So the woman stayed and nursed her son until she had weaned him.

Parents with Purpose prepare their kids to "GO" share the message of Jesus to the World

1 Samuel 1:24 NKJV - Now when she had weaned him, she took him up with her, with three bulls, one ephah of flour, and a skin of wine, and brought him to the house of the Lord in Shiloh. And the child was young.

1 Samuel 1:25 NKJV - Then they slaughtered a bull, and brought the child to Eli.

1 Samuel 1:26 NKJV - And she said, "O my lord! As your soul lives, my lord, I am the woman who stood by you here, praying to the Lord.

1 Samuel 1:27 NKJV - For this child I prayed, and the Lord has granted me my petition which I asked of Him.

1 Samuel 1:28 NKJV - Therefore I also have lent him to the Lord; as long as he lives he shall be lent to the Lord." So they worshiped the Lord there.

SAMUEL AND THE KINGS



A WALK THROUGH THE HIGH POINTS OF THE BOOKS OF SAMUEL, 1ST AND 2ND KINGS

This month we are learning about the first two kings of Israel. They were two very different kinds of kings. Saul was afraid, didn't trust God and disobeyed. David was brave, did trust God and mostly obeyed. We want our kids to know they have choices too but life is better if we decide to trust and obey God. Just look at how Saul and David's life turned out.

Memory Verse: The LORD doesn't see things the way you see them. People judge by outward appearance, but the LORD looks at the heart 1 Samuel 16:7b

Heart of the Lesson: David and Jonathan's friendship - 1 Samuel 18

Parent Engagement: Parents, share about your best childhood friend. Ask your kids who is their best friend and why. Talk about what makes a good friend and make a card for them.

Kids are mirroring the parenting series but through their eyes. We are challenging them to think of their physical and spiritual families. What legacy do they come from? How are they connecting, growing and then going as a

family? What legacy do they want to leave? This is a great series to ask your kids what they are learning and engage in spiritual conversations.

Memory Verse: "I remember your genuine faith, for you share the faith that first filled your grandmother Lois and your mother, Eunice. And I know that same faith continues strong in you." 2 Timothy 1:5

Heart of the Lesson: How do you Connect with your physical and spiritual family? John 13:33-35

Parent Engagement: When does your family connect together? Do you have a regular time during the week? If not, schedule time in the calendar. Ask your kids what their favorite time is with you.
