Jesus commands us to love one another

A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another; as I have loved you, that you also love one another. **John 13:34 NKJV**

We love one another to be like Jesus

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This month we are learning that Jesus is alive, and that He loves us! We are learning the Easter story and how Jesus raised from the dead for us!

Memory Verse: “Jesus is Alive” Mark 16:6B (Adapted for Toddlers)

Heart of the Lesson: Jesus is Alive and With Us All the Time

Parent Connect: Hang your toddler’s cross craft somewhere special where you will see it and remember our lesson all week. Ask your toddler: Who’s alive? (Jesus.) Say: We’ve been learning that Jesus is alive. We know that Jesus lives and that He promises new life to everyone who believes in him. Isn’t that wonderful? Let’s fold our hands and say a prayer to thank God that Jesus lives. Say: Repeat after me. Dear God (pause for kids to repeat) thank you (pause for kids to repeat) for Jesus. (pause for kids to repeat) Thank you (pause for kids to repeat) that Jesus is alive. (pause for kids to repeat) In Jesus name, Amen. (pause for kids to repeat)



In this series we will learn about Jesus teachings, His miracles, His death and resurrection. We will wrap up with Jesus’ ascension as He goes to Heaven. Through the series, we will learn each story shows us how Jesus loves us and how Jesus is the perfect example of how we should love others!

Memory Verse: “For God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish, but have eternal life.” John 3:16 (NLT)

Heart of the Lesson: Lazarus Raised | John 11:1-44

Parent Connect: Today we learned of another miracle Jesus did, showing how He loved others! Jesus went to a man named Lazarus who had died and raised him to life! Wow! Play with your kid a game pretending to be Lazarus and Jesus. Lazarus covers with a blanket and Jesus says “Lazarus, come out!” Have Lazarus jump out! Wow what a miracle!



G.R.O.W. fosters spiritual growth, like plants nurtured in fertile soil. This series explores what happens when we spend time with God: Growth, Rest, Outreach, and Worship.

Memory Verse: But the godly will flourish like palm trees and grow strong like cedars of Lebanon. For they are transplanted to the LORD’s own house. They flourish in the courts of our God. Even in old age they will still produce fruit; they will remain vital and green. Psalm 92:12-14

Heart of the Lesson: Spending Time with God Helps Us Rest - Psalm 23:2, Mark 6:39, Matthew 11:28-30

Parent Connect: Make a play tent using sheets and furniture. Grab some pillows and a blanket to rest inside of it and read the Bible with a flashlight.



Did you know that there are more than 50 commands of how Christians should treat one another in the New Testament? In this series, we will be exploring the different “one another” passages to discover what it looks like to be in the body of Christ.

Memory Verse: “So now I am giving you a new commandment: Love each other. Just as I have loved you, you should love each other.” John 13:34

Heart of the Lesson: As Christians, we are called to honor one another – Romans 12:10

Parent Connect: Ask your student: who is someone they honor/respect? How can we humble ourselves and show honor to one another?



We need each other in the church! Our church family can encourage us and help us grow closer to Jesus. But we need to build friendships with each other to be able to help each other grow closer to Jesus! This series, we’re looking at what the Bible says about how we can love one another well so that we know Jesus better too.

Memory Verse: I give you a new command. Love one another. You must love one another, just as I have loved you. (John 13:34 NIRV)

Heart of the Lesson: We are more like Jesus when we “love one another” (Romans 15:5,7,14 , John 13:34, Romans 12:10, 2 Peter 1:5-8)
